Section 28.00—Department of Public Health, Fiscal Year 2022-23 Budget Adjustment

Pursuant to the provisions of Section 28.00, Budget Act of 2022, the following report is respectfully submitted.

The California Department of Public Health (CDPH) requests an increase in expenditure authority of \$4.6 million in Item 4265-001-0890 of the 2022 Budget Act. CDPH received a \$6 million supplemental award in August 2024 for surveying activities for the fiscal year 2022-23 and needs this additional authority to spend the full award.

This request supports the CDPH Center for Health Care Quality's survey work related to Medicare, in accordance with the US Department of Health and Human Services' Center for Medicare and Medicaid Services requirements. The Center for Health Care Quality utilizes federal resources to certify that health facilities accepting Medicare payments meet various federal requirements establishing critical health and safety standards. In addition, CDPH requested a waiver of the 30-day review period. The Department of Finance concurs with this request and will augment CDPH's budget upon JLBC approval of the requested waiver of the 30-day review period.

This request meets the following criteria, as required in subdivision (b) of Section 28.00:

- The funds will be expended to support a federally mandated workload on surveys related to Medicare, which is consistent with state law.
- The funds are made available to the state under conditions permitting their use only for the specified purpose, and the additional expenditure proposed would apply to this specified funding purpose.
- Acceptance of the additional funding does not impose on the state any requirement to commit or expend new state funds for any program or purpose.
- The need exists to expend the additional funding for a prior fiscal year because the Department has overspent their authority in 2022-23.

Finance concurs with the necessity of this change to the approved budget and will be approving the Section 28.00 application not sooner than 30 days from the above date.

PART A: For what purpose will the funds be expended?

The Center for Health Care Quality (CHCQ) receives Federal Fund authority to fund a federally mandated workload on surveys related to Title 18 – Medicare. CHCQ has overspent their 2022-23 federal fund authority by approximately \$4.6 million. On August 22, 2024, CHCQ received a supplemental award of \$6 million for 2022-23 for Title 18 – Medicare. Our Accounting counterpart recently reported that we have the cash, but an insufficient amount of authority to spend. Therefore, this 2022-23 BR for the amount of \$4.6 million is needed.

PART B: Explain the need to expend the funds in the current fiscal year, including the consequence of waiting until budget year to expend the funds:

CHCQ needs the funding for Fiscal Year (FY) 2022-23 because they overspent their 2022-23 federal fund authority. The supplemental award they received was specifically for budget period 2022-23. In addition, since this revision is for FY 2022-23 which will be reverted in June 2025, and since this is related to FY 2022-23 Plan of Financial Adjustment, which it should be cleared by March 2025, we need to expedite this BR request.

Title T18 Survey & Certification (S&C) Medicare	Section 28 Budget Act of 2022				

DESCRIPTION:

The California Department of Public Health (CDPH), Center for Health Care Quality (CHCQ), Licensing & Certification (L&C) Program is responsible for regulatory oversight of licensed health care facilities and health care professionals to assess the safety, effectiveness, and health care quality for all Californians. CHCQ fulfills this role by conducting periodic inspections and complaint investigations of health care facilities to determine compliance with federal and state laws and regulations. CHCQ licenses and certifies over 15,000 health care facilities and agencies in California in 30 different licensure and certification categories.

The U.S. Department of Health and Human Services' Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS) awards federal grant monies to CHCQ to certify that facilities accepting Medicare and Medicaid (Medi-Cal) payments meet federal requirements. CHCQ evaluates health care facilities for compliance with federal laws and regulations. These activities are funded by federal funds (Title XVIII Medicare and Title XIX Medicaid Grants)

JUSTIFICATION:

The Department of Public Health respectfully requests an increased expenditure authority in item 4265-001-0890 (Federal Trust Fund 0890) for the Center for Health Care Quality (CHCQ) to fund a federally mandated workload on surveys related to Title 18 – Medicare.

CHCQ has overspent their Fiscal Year (FY) 2022-23 federal fund authority by approximately \$4.6 million. On August 22, 2024, CHCQ received a supplemental award of \$6 million for FY 2022-23 for Title 18 – Medicare. The Accounting Unit recently reported that we have the cash but an insufficient amount of authority to spend.

In March 2023 of the May Revision budget building season for FY 2023-24, we initially intended to increase CHCQ's Federal Fund authority to prevent over expenditure issues but were advised by our Finance colleagues (see attached email) to wait until all Notice of Awards (NOAs) pertaining to Title 18 – Medicare have been received in order to process the complete amount in order to prevent any negative consequences of not receiving it timely through a Control Section 28.00 budget revision. The award was not received in time to meet Finance's June 15th cutoff and we therefore withdrew our BR request. However, Finance confirmed at the time that any revision needed in the future can be applied retroactively.

Therefore, we are submitting a BR for a \$4.6 million increase in state operations federal fund authority for 2022-23 in order for CHCQ to fund a federally mandated workload on surveys related to Title 18 – Medicare, and not lose an opportunity returning this funding to the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS).

This notification was not sent to Finance within 45 days of receipt of the additional award because CDPH was unaware that there was a need for additional expenditure authority until recently.
