Section 28.50—Judicial Council Reimbursement Authority Increase for Byrne State Crisis Intervention Program Funding

Pursuant to the provisions of Section 28.50, Budget Act of 2024, the following report is respectfully submitted.

The Department of Finance has received a request from the Judicial Council to increase its reimbursement authority by \$14,920,000 to award the remaining State Crisis Intervention Program (SCIP) funding included in the Budget Act of 2023 and receive additional federal SCIP funding in fiscal year 2024-25. These funds are obtained through a contract with the Board of State and Community Corrections to support a statewide project to improve the execution of firearm relinquishment and expand collaborative courts.

The Budget Act of 2023 allocated these funds to the trial courts over a three-year period. However, it is essential to provide courts with the necessary timeframe for program setup, implementation and outcomes tracking.

Finance concurs with the necessity of this change to the approved budget and requests a waiver of the 30-day review period to allow the Judicial Council to allocate these funds as soon as possible.

DESCRIPTION:	

Pursuant to Control Section 28.50 of the Budget Act of 2024, the Judicial Council requests an increase in reimbursement authority of \$14.9 million in Schedule 3 of Item 0250-101-0001 due to (1) changes in the Judicial Council's current expenditure plan for the Byrne State Crisis Intervention Program (SCIP) and (2) additional federal funding to be received through the Board of State and Community Corrections (BSCC).

JUSTIFICATION:

The Judicial Council received federal Byrne State Crisis Intervention Program (SCIP) funds through the Board of State and Community Corrections to make grants to California courts to support a statewide project to improve execution of firearm relinquishment and expand collaborative courts. An increase of reimbursement authority for Item 0250-101-0001 is required to encumber the funds awarded to the trial courts in the current fiscal year. The total amount of reimbursement authority needed is \$24.7 million. The current authority in the item is \$9.8 million. Therefore, a \$14.9 million increase in reimbursement authority for fiscal year (FY) 2024–25 is required to support the Byrne SCIP program.
