Section 28.00—Department of Fish and Wildlife, Federal Expenditure Authority

Pursuant to the provisions of section 28.00, Budget Act 2024, the following report is respectfully submitted.

The Department of Finance has received the attached Section 28.00 application from the Department of Fish and Wildlife (CDFW) for the purpose of increasing federal expenditure authority by \$23,151,000 to reflect awarded competitive grants in the current fiscal year. Awarded grants include pass-through dollars to other entities, as well as funding for the Department to implement existing ecosystem restoration projects.

The CDFW received official notification of the availability of additional, unanticipated funds on April 18, 2025 and notified Finance within 45 days of this date.

This request meets the following criteria, as required in subdivision (b) of Section 28.00:

- The funds will be expended for projects awarded from the Fisheries Restoration Grant Program, Sport Fish Restoration Act Grant Program and the Pittman-Robertson Act Grant Program, which is consistent with state law.
- The funds are made available to the state under conditions permitting their use only for the specified purpose, and the additional expenditure proposed would apply to this specified funding purpose.
- Acceptance of the additional funding does not impose on the state any requirement to commit or expend new state funds for any program or purpose.
- The need exists to expend the additional funding during the current fiscal year because without additional federal authority, the CDFW will not be able to fully utilize the federal grants received in this current fiscal year.

Finance concurs with the necessity of this change to the approved budget and respectfully requests an expedited review and waiver of the 30-day waiting requirement in order to approve the section 28.00 application to meet the CDFW operational needs and allow these funds to be encumbered prior to the end of the fiscal year.

The purpose of this grant is to provide funding to the California Department of Fish and Wildlife (CDFW), through its Fisheries Restoration Grant Program, in order to implement salmonid restoration strategies, which focus on large-scale, process-based restoration projects that self-sustain natural ecosystem functions and processes.

PART B: Explain the need to expend the funds in the current fiscal year, including the consequence of waiting until budget year to expend the funds:

The funds need to be expended this fiscal year because the United States Department of Commerce (USDOC) has approved a grant to the CDFW in the current year. CDFW receives these grants from USDOC annually, and if we do not expend in the current year, this will cause budget year to go over.

DESCRIPTION:

CDFW requests a one-time increase in reimbursement authority in the amount of \$4,347,000 for recovery and restoration of salmonid species and their habitat, which includes restoring anadromous fish habitat in order to ensure the survival and protection of salmon and steelhead trout in California's anadromous watersheds.

JUSTIFICATION:

The requested additional reimbursement authority is needed to continue California's recovery efforts to remove limiting factors to Federal Endangered Species Act listed salmonids. This includes two of National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration's Species in the Spotlight: Central California Coast coho salmon, Sacramento River winter-run Chinook salmon, and salmonids that contribute to the prey base for southern resident killer whales. Without the funds, this limits the ability of fish to survive and successfully reproduce in coastal and inland streams that historically produced large populations of salmon and steelhead. If this request is denied, CDFW would not be able to issue out these grants to do this work that is vital to meeting CDFW's mission.
