#### Section 28.00—Department of Health Care Services

Pursuant to the provisions of Section 28.00, Budget Act of 2025, the following report is respectfully submitted.

The Department of Finance has received the attached Section 28.00 application from the Department of Health Care Services (DHCS) for the purpose of increasing local assistance expenditure authority in Item 4260-115-0890 by \$20,043,000 for Program 3960050—Other Care Services. The increase is needed to expend the California 988 Suicide and Crisis Lifeline grant awarded by the federal Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration.

DHCS received official notification of the availability of additional, unanticipated funds on September 29, 2025 and notified Finance within 45 days of this date.

This request meets the following criteria, as required in subdivision (b) of Section 28.00:

- The funds will be expended to address behavioral health crisis through the 988 network, specifically to expand the crisis response workforce, support the growing 988 demand, and enhance public awareness – particularly among high-risk populations. These funds will also support individuals' connections with services such as mobile crisis outreach and crisis stabilization services.
- The funds are made available to the state under conditions permitting their use only for the specified purpose, and the additional expenditure proposed would apply to this specified funding purpose.
- Acceptance of the additional funding does not impose on the state any requirement to commit or expend new state funds for any program or purpose.
- Due to the September 29, 2026 federal expenditure deadline, the need exists to adjust the expenditure authority in the current fiscal year.
   Otherwise, the department could be at risk of not fully expending the federal funds.

Finance concurs with the necessity of this change to the approved budget. Finance respectfully requests an expedited review of the submission and a waiver of the 30-day waiting requirement.

#### PART A: For what purpose will the funds be expended?

This control section 28.00 requests to increase authority for Fiscal Year (FY) 2025-26 for item appropriation 4260-115-0890 for local assistance for implementing and administering the California 988 Suicide and Crisis Lifeline grant awarded by the Substance Abuse and Mental health Services Administration (SAMHSA).

The 988 grant funds will be used to address behavioral health crisis through the 988 network, specifically to expand the crisis response workforce, support the growing 988 demand, and enhance public awareness – particularly among highrisk populations. The funding will also support ongoing connections with individuals' post-contact, and support connections with services such as mobile crisis outreach and crisis stabilization services.

# PART B: Explain the need to expend the funds in the current fiscal year, including the consequence of waiting until budget year to expend the funds:

The funds are needed in FY 2025-26 to support the continued growth and improvement of the California 988 network. This network provides essential crisis services to individuals at high risk of suicide, operating 24 hours a day, 7 days a week, 365 days a year. Services include suicide risk screenings and assessments, de-escalation, and connecting individuals to appropriate community resources, including mobile crisis and crisis stabilization services.

Delaying this funding until FY 2026-27 would undermine the intended use of these federal funds. A delay would hinder the State's ability to fully develop the 988 program and would result in unspent funds being returned to SAMHSA, as well as potentially lead to the unnecessary loss of life.

# PROGRAM PROPOSAL (Attach additional information as necessary) TITLE: CALIFORNIA 988 SUICIDE AND CRISIS LIFELINE STATUTORY AUTHORITY: (state, federal, as appropriate) Section 520E-3&520A of PHS Act (42 USC 290bb-36c & 290bb-32)

#### **DESCRIPTION:**

California's priority for this grant is to enhance the 988 programs in California by expanding the workforce and maximizing call, chat, and text responses; thereby increasing access to the crisis care system in the State of California, and improving outcomes for high-risk populations.

DHCS has the following goals for this grant:

- 1) Recruit, hire, and train behavioral health workforce to staff California's 988 Crisis Centers to increase the capacity to respond, intervene, and provide follow-up to individuals experiencing a behavioral health crisis.
- 2) Enhance coordination among 988 Crisis Centers, 911, and mobile crisis services across California; and
- 3) Implement a comprehensive 988 communication strategy, informed by enhanced statewide data collection.

#### JUSTIFICATION:

DHCS is requesting a waiver of the 30-day notice requirement, as California is experiencing significant growth in 988 contact volume and urgently needs additional funding to support 988 Crisis Center operations and meet increasing demand. Based on current projections for growth in 988 calls, chats, and texts (collectively referred to as "contacts"), and corresponding staffing level recommendations for 988 Crisis Centers, DHCS anticipates a funding shortfall in FY 2025–26 without the requested support.

From May 2024 through April 2025, California averaged over 52,000 988 contacts per month—a 57 percent increase from the 33,101 contacts received at the time of implementation in July 2022.

In addition to this natural growth, DHCS expects a substantial increase in 988 contacts due to national media campaigns and a recently launched statewide campaign by DHCS. Further growth is anticipated as 988 becomes more integrated into the behavioral health crisis care continuum and as 911–988 interoperability improves, making it easier to transfer callers from 911 to 988. The expansion of chat and text services is also expected to contribute to this increase.

This grant opportunity will help strengthen the 988 network across all 58 counties by funding efforts to coordinate behavioral health services, promote project sustainability, and raise awareness of behavioral health crisis resources in California. These grant funds will support critical functions and activities necessary for the successful deployment and administration of the California 988 network.
