Pursuant to provision 5 of Item 0890-001-0001, 2022 Budget Act, the following report is respectfully submitted.

The Department of Finance has received a request from the Secretary of State to use \$3,240,000 for the California Automated Lobbyist and Campaign Contribution and Expenditure Search System (Cal-ACCESS) Replacement System project for project activities, such as staffing costs and technology costs for data readiness. Provision 5 allows for \$3,240,000 to be available to the Secretary of State for the Cal-ACCESS Replacement System project contingent upon California Department of Technology (CDT) approval of the appropriate Project Approval Lifecycle documents. The CDT has approved the Stage 1 Business Analysis within the Project Approval Lifecycle and approved the project to move to Stage 2.

Finance concurs with the request and will approve the allocation of funds no sooner than 30 days from the above date.

Request for the Release of Funding Appropriated for the California Automated Lobbyist and Campaign Contribution and Expenditure Search System Replacement System Project

In accordance with Provision 5, Item 0890-001-0001, Section 2.00, Budget Act of 2022 (Chapter 45, Statutes of 2022 (AB 178)), the Secretary of State requests the use of \$3,240,000 already appropriated by the Legislature for project activities related to the California Automated Lobbyist and Campaign Contribution and Expenditure Search System Replacement System (CARS) project. Specifically, \$1.6 million will support staffing costs and \$1.64 million will support technology costs for data readiness. Provision 5 specifies that the use of the funding is contingent upon the California Department of Technology (CDT) approval of the appropriate Project Approval Lifecycle documents. The CDT has approved the Stage 1 Business Analysis within the Project Approval Lifecycle for the CARS project effort (see Attachment I). In addition, the CDT has approved the CARS project to move to Stage 2 of the Project Approval Lifecycle planning process.

SUBJECT: PROJECT APPROVAL LIFECYCLE, STAGE 1 – S1BA APPROVAL AND NEXT STEPS – SECRETARY OF STATE (SOS) – CAL-ACCESS REPLACEMENT SYSTEM (CARS)

Dear Dr. Weber:

The California Department of Technology (CDT) recognizes the exemption to certain CDT authority as detailed in Senate Bill 1349 (SB-1349), Statues of 2020. As requested, and by agreement and memorandum of understanding (MOU) between the Secretary of State and the CDT, oversight services are provided in furtherance of project objectives.

The CDT has approved the Stage 1 Business Analysis (S1BA), Gate 1 within the Project Approval Lifecycle (PAL) for the Secretary of State (SOS) - CAL-ACCESS Replacement System (CARS) effort. According to the State Administrative Manual (SAM) Section 4819.37, and in consideration of the MOU, CARS is a non-delegated project and oversight services will be provided by the CDT through the remaining PAL planning stages. The CDT has reviewed the business complexity assessment and it is Medium Complexity.

The CARS is approved to move to Stage 2 of the PAL planning process.

Unless the CARS requests and is approved for a Project Delegation Request, and in consideration of the MOU, the next step in the PAL planning process is preparation for Stage 2 Alternatives Analysis development. A Collaborative Review/Stage 2 Kickoff meeting will be scheduled by the CDT to discuss what is required to advance to the next PAL stage, and ultimately receive the CDT's final project approval.

The meeting must include individuals who will be vested with the role of executive project sponsor, project manager or project lead, and participants to represent business/program areas, administrative services, including

budgets, procurement, and information technology. This is critical to foster a common understanding of what the planning work will entail, and to promote greater teamwork and better communication once the project is underway.

Now that the S1BA is approved, the CARS should be aware of budget actions and CDT's timelines as shown in SAM Section 4819.42 and State Information Management Manual (SIMM) Section 05A. As the CARS effort moves through the PAL planning process, the SOS should be familiar with the reporting criteria in SAM Section 4819.37. If one or more of the criteria no longer applies or the S1BA information changes substantially, the SOS could be required to submit a revised S1BA with updated approval signatures to the CDT using the SIMM Section G, Executive Transmittal.
