List of Changes Pursuant to Section 19.56 (AB 179, Ch. 249/2022)

Pursuant to Section 19.56 of Chapter 249, Statutes of 2022, the Department of Finance respectfully submits Attachment 1, which reflects changes to the local fiscal agents and state entities authorized to allocate funding appropriated in Section 19.56. Under Provision 6 of this section, Finance may authorize the transfer of allocating authority to a different state entity to facilitate the expenditure of the funds as intended by the legislature. Additionally, the allocating authority may, in consultation with Finance, use an alternative local fiscal agent.

Attachment 1 identifies the authorized changes to local fiscal agents in Column C and allocating authorities in Column E. Finance worked in close consultation with legislative staff to coordinate these changes.

Finance requests an expedited review of the submission and a waiver of the 30-day waiting requirement.
