**Section 28.00—Department of Community Services and Development,
Item 4700-101-0890, Local Assistance**

Pursuant to Section 28.00 of the Budget Act of 2022, the following report is respectfully submitted.

The Department of Finance has received the attached Section 28.00 application from the Department of Community Services and Development (CSD) for the purpose of increasing its Federal Trust Fund authority for Program 4181-Energy Programs within Item 4700-101-0890 by \$82,303,000. The CSD received supplemental funding from the Disaster Relief Supplemental Appropriations Act (DRSAA) (approximately \$46,826,000) and an increase to the annual Low-Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP) Block Grant (approximately \$43,253,000) for LIHEAP. The CSD is not requesting expenditure authority for the full amount of the augmentations because there is flexibility within CSD's existing authority to absorb a portion of the total increase. This request will enable the CSD to begin assisting more low-income families with energy needs as soon as possible and help to make sure the CSD is able to expend the funds in a timely manner. The CSD is required to obligate at least 90 percent of the LIHEAP funds by September 30, 2023.

The CSD received official notification of the availability of additional, unanticipated funds on February 21, 2023, for funding from the DRSAA and two notifications reflecting the adjustments to the annual LIHEAP Block Grant on March 6, 2023, and March 10, 2023. The CSD notified Finance within 45 days of these dates.

This request meets the following criteria, as required in subdivision (b) of Section 28.00:

- The funds will be expended for the purpose of assisting low-income Californians with energy costs through LIHEAP, which is consistent with state law.

- The funds are made available to the state under conditions permitting their use only for the specified purpose, and the additional expenditure proposed would apply to this specified funding purpose.
- Acceptance of the additional funding does not impose on the state any requirement to commit or expend new state funds for any program or purpose.
- The need exists to expend the additional funding during the current fiscal year to allow the CSD to provide assistance to more low-income families with their energy needs as quickly as possible, and to enable the CSD to fully expend the LIHEAP funds within the required time frame. At least 90 percent of the awards must be obligated by September 30, 2023.

Finance concurs with the necessity of this change to the approved budget. A waiver of the 30-day review period is requested to enable the CSD to administer these dollars as quickly as possible to assist low-income Californians with energy needs.

PART A: For what purpose will the funds be expended?

The additional supplemental funding from the Disaster Relief Supplemental Appropriations Act and an increase to the annual LIHEAP Block Grant award will be used to increase services to low-income families through the existing Low-Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP).

The Department will expend these funds for a purpose that is consistent with Federal law. Pursuant to Government Code section 16367.5, the Department of Community Services and Development shall receive and administer the federal Low-Income Home Energy Assistance Program Block Grant, provided for pursuant to the Low-Income Home Energy Assistance (LIHEA) Act of 1981, as amended (42 U.S.C. Sec. 8621 et seq.).

PART B: Explain the need to expend the funds in the current fiscal year, including the consequence of waiting until budget year to expend the funds:

The Disaster Relief Supplemental Appropriations Act is supplemental funding for LIHEAP. At least 90 percent of these awards must be obligated by September 30, 2023. As such, it is imperative that the Department has the ability to administer these dollars as quickly as possible to start assisting low-income Californians with energy needs. Waiting until budget year will delay these services and impact the Department's ability to expend funds in a timely manner.

DESCRIPTION:

LIHEAP is a critical program for vulnerable low-income Californians as they spend a disproportionate percentage of their income on energy costs, and without LIHEAP, could be forced to make painful choices between heating or cooling their homes or paying for other necessities such as food, medicine, and clothing.

JUSTIFICATION:

For federal fiscal year 2023, the Federal Government passed the Disaster Relief Supplemental Appropriations Act Public Law 117-328, as supplementary funding to LIHEAP.

The Budget Act of 2022 does not provide for the necessary state authority to obligate the total current year federal appropriations. Therefore, the Department of Community Services and Development is requesting an increase of \$82,303,000 in local assistance Federal Trust Fund spending authority for state fiscal year 2022-23. This augmentation will give the Department of Community Services and Development the level of authority necessary to fully expend the federal grant funds that have been awarded for LIHEAP.
