Section 28.00—Department of Veterans Affairs, United States Veterans Administration Grant

Pursuant to the provisions of Section 28.00, 2020 Budget Act, the following report is respectfully submitted.

The Department of Finance has received the attached Section 28.00 application from the Department of Veterans Affairs (CalVet) to increase Federal Trust Fund authority to accept a federal grant from the United States Department of Veterans Affairs. The grant provides funding for COVID-19 infection control efforts within CalVet Veterans Homes, including conducting testing and acquiring personal protective equipment. The total amount of the grant is \$9,725,000, of which \$2 million is expected to be expended in fiscal year 2020-21 and \$7,725,000 is expected to be expended in 2021-22. As such, the attached Section 28.00 application requests an increase in Federal Trust Fund authority of \$2 million in 2020-21 and the May Revision includes a one-time increase in Federal Trust Fund authority of \$7,725,000 in 2021-22.

CalVet received official notification of the availability of additional, unanticipated funds on March 18, 2021 and notified Finance within 45 days of this date.

This request meets the following criteria, as required in subdivision (b) of Section 28.00:

- The funds will be expended for COVID-19 prevention and mitigation efforts which is consistent with state law.
- The funds are made available to the state under conditions permitting their use only for the specified purpose, and the additional expenditure proposed would apply to this specified funding purpose.
- Acceptance of the additional funding does not impose on the state any requirement to commit or expend new state funds for any program or purpose.
- The need exists to expend the additional funding during the current fiscal year to respond to the COVID-19 Pandemic, including conducting testing and acquiring personal protection equipment.

We concur with the necessity of this change to the approved budget and will be approving the Section 28.00 application not sooner than 30 days from the above date.

DESCRIPTION:

The Consolidated Appropriations Act, 2021 (Public Law 116-260) provides funding to support state veterans homes COVID-19 efforts. The funds will be used to support the COVID-19 infection control efforts, including conducting appropriate testing, acquiring necessary personal protective equipment (PPE), supplies, and equipment, investing in staff, and establishing COVID-19 isolation facilities in the CalVet Veterans Homes.

JUSTIFICATION:

Acceptance of the USDVA funding is needed to ensure that the CalVet Veterans Homes will have additional funding available for continuing their efforts prevent, prepare for, and respond to the coronavirus and keep residents safe. The cost of required overtime, PPE, and infection control measures is beyond the prepandemic costs. This funding will provide CalVet with the ability to continue to purchase the goods and services needed to protect its vulnerable residents.

Part B:

The United States Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) provided funding through the Consolidated Appropriations Act, 2021 (Public Law 116-260) for State Veterans Homes. Funds allocated pursuant to this section are to be used to provide a one-time emergency payment to existing State Veterans Homes to prevent, prepare for, and respond to COVID-19. The payments are in proportion to each state's share of the total resident capacity in such facilities as of the date of enactment of the Act, December 27, 2020, where such capacity includes only veterans on whose behalf the VA pays a per diem payment pursuant to 38 U.S.C. 1741 or 1745. CalVet was notified of this funding on March 17, 2021. Finance was notified on March 18, 2021. On March 23, 2021 and March 24, 2021, the CalVet Veterans Homes certified their December 27, 2020, census with the VA. All invoices were submitted by CalVet to the VA for each homes' share of the funding by April 21, 2021. Funds were received beginning on April 28, 2021 through early May.

In total, CalVet received \$9,725,346.45 in VA funding of which \$2 million is requested for current year expenditure authority. The current year funding will support COVID-19 expenditures in West Los Angeles, Lancaster, Ventura, and Barstow Veterans Homes. The Lancaster and Ventura homes were not eligible to receive funding from the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services that were received by the other five Veterans Homes as they do not operate a skilled nursing facility. The VA funding is the only additional funding received by these two Veterans Homes to offset their COVID-19 costs.

Authority for the balance, \$7.725 million, will be requested in fiscal year 2021-22.

III. SUMMARY OF PROPOSED REQUEST

The California Department of Veterans Affairs (CalVet) requests an increase in Item 8955-001-0890 of \$2,000,000 to accept a federal grant from the United States Department of Veterans Affairs. The grant provides funding for COVID-19 infection control efforts within CalVet Veterans Homes, including conducting testing and acquiring personal protective equipment.

The total amount of the grant is \$9,725,000, of which \$2 million is expected to be expended in 2020-21 and \$7,725,000 is expected to be expended in 2021-22. As such, this budget revision requests an increase in Federal Trust Fund authority of \$2 million in 2020-21 and the May Revision includes a one-time increase in Federal Trust Fund authority of \$7,725,000 in 2021-22.
